Healthy Start

Being and staying healthy is such an Important factor in everyone's life.

There is support for eligible parents to buy certain foods.



Who might be eligible?

If you're more than 10 weeks pregnant or have a child under 4, you may be entitled to get help to buy healthy food and milk. You can use your card to buy:

- -plain liquid cow's milk
- -fresh, frozen, and tinned fruit and vegetables
- -fresh, dried, and tinned pulses
- -infant formula milk based on cow's milk

You can also use your card to collect:

- -Healthy Start vitamins these support you during pregnancy and breastfeeding
- -vitamin drops for babies and young children these are suitable from birth to 4 years old

As you can see attendance levels were not good last week – no year group reached the minimum 95% expected. This is impacting on our yearly total. There are still a lot of illnesses, including chickenpox around, which make it even more important that children don't stay off school for trivial reasons or because they just don't feel like it.

Like any respiratory illness, Covid is more likely to be around in the Winter months. If you choose to test your child if they are ill and they are positive, they should stay at home for 3 days. If they have no temperature, they can return after that.

Please remind your children to practice good hygiene – washing hands regularly can stop a lot of illness spreading.



Governors

Our school Governing body are a group of volunteers whose responsibility it is to oversee the running of the school. They are our "critical friends."

One of their responsibilities is to check that the users of the school – children and parents – are happy and to listen to any suggestions of how things might change.
