Please help us to look after our school and our children!

We are sad to have to write that we need your help. There are an increasing number of occasions when children from school (and their older siblings or friends) are not being properly supervised before or after school and are behaving in a way which could hurt others or damage school property.

Nursery/Reception outdoor area

These areas are designed for children no older than 5. **Please do not let your older children play on the equipment after school.** Younger children also need to be supervised – they could hurt themselves or others. The Nursery outdoor area cost £25,000 3 years ago – the school will not have that money again to replace or repair it.

Bikes and scooters

Although we want to encourage children to use a healthy way to come to school, our school paths are not big enough to accommodate bikes or scooters being ridden. All bikes and scooters should be walked to the school gates – not ridden around paths or on the playground. Please remember these should be locked up during the day at the designated places.

Electric scooters must not be brought into school.

Dogs

Please do not bring dogs onto school grounds. If they are left at the school gates, they should be supervised and securely tied to railings.

After School Clubs

Letters were sent home on Friday to children who have been given a place at a club. All clubs (EXCEPT GARDENING) start this week and finish at 4pm. Please ensure your child attends – there are disappointed children who could have places which are not used.
