Earth Day Monday 22nd April

We hope you received and read the letter emailed to families last week about Earth Day.

We will be marking the day in various ways such as learning more about the environment, joining with a nation-wide virtual assembly and inviting children to make a promise to do their bit to look after the environment.

Our focus will be "from small starts come big impacts." Our school motto "inspiring success" is a promise to help every child to achieve their dreams. In the same way, by working together, making small changes, our children can see how powerful they can be to impact change.

We are starting with challenging waste.

By making different decisions about how we use resources, we can reduce waste.

We have asked you for your help tomorrow. If your child has a packed lunch, or brings a snack, please support them by using reusable boxes and reducing the number of prepackaged foods.

Pre-packed foods, although convenient, cause a huge amount of waste and also tend to include highly processed foods which are not healthy choices for any of us. Children who have school dinners will also be encouraged to reduce waste food by only taking what they want and eating rather than wasting it.





Looking after our school environment and belongings is also very important.

The "lost property" mountain hasn't got any smaller. Remember to name all items. If your child has lost anything, please ask them to look at these things or if they area very little, you are invited to come to the office to look for yourself. We have now had many of these coats and jumpers for over 6 weeks and will add them to our 2nd hand stock after this week, if not collected. Any non-school items will be given to charity.





Attendance

It has been a varied week with some very good and very poor attendance. The "Friday sickness" is still evident.

Here is a screen shot of the daily averages this year.

We know how hard it can be on a Friday at the end of a long week, but school is just as important on a Friday as it is on any other day. There is no "easy day" – every day counts.

Please only keep your child at home if they are too sick to come in. Sometimes coming in will take their mind off the slight symptoms they might have and they will forget all about them.

"Good" attendance is set by the Government at over 96%. None of our year groups have currently achieved this. Any child with attendance below 90% is classed as persistently absent.
