Please send your child to school with: a sun hat (with name clearly written)





a drink in a labelled, refillable bottle – water or weak squash. No fizzy drinks or energy drinks, please.



Apply sun protection before they come to school. Staff will apply more, with your permission, to younger children.



It is so important that young skin is protected from the sun – at home and at school. Where necessary, we will reduce periods outside and provide extra shade.

Probably though, the rain will return next week, so don't forget to send coats too!


School breaks up on Thursday 23rd May and will return Monday 3rd June.

School assessments

Teachers assess how children are doing at school every day. Each year more formal assessments are made in certain year groups. As you will see overleaf, Year 6 sit their SATS next week. Coming soon: Reception – teacher assessment on all areas of learning

Year 1 – children will be assessed on their phonics knowledge in June.

Year 2 – teachers are currently making assessments on reading, writing and maths. Some small paper tests support this judgement. Year 4 – will take a computer-based multiplication table test in June.

Keep practising year 4!






Another chance to get your voice heard
