It is a system which holds a vast amount of information and will be used to manage all key data about our pupils and families. It will also be the system we use for parent payments and bookings for clubs etc. Although this is not live yet, we will be switching to this functionality over the next few weeks.

Currently, a quarter of our families have downloaded and logged on to the Arbor parent portal app – we now need EVERYONE to do it. We will be moving to the parent app to send messages rather than text and aim to do this by the end of the month.
