During our staff training on Monday, we spent time talking about our school culture, particularly around children's behaviour and how we all conduct ourselves. We have introduced our "High 5" - 5 fundamental ways to behave which help children to achieve our values, particularly ensuring that they are learning to the best of their ability. Over the next few weeks, we will be focusing on a key aspect at a time. This week it has been "Wonderful Walking." This has been chosen so that children are not only moving safely around school, staying in safe places but are also showing respect for those around them, taking care of each other. The 'High 5' will also give staff a common language to remind children what is expected of them and to praise them when they are meeting them. Feel free to use some of them at home too!

The children have responded really well so far. They have enjoyed not only recognising when they are meeting the expectations themselves, but also their friends and teachers! We have stressed that the 'High 5' will help EVERYONE to be successful - not just children!

Children in Year 5 and Year 3 will start swimming this week. Year 5 go on TUESDAY; Year 3 THURSDAY. If you have not returned your permission slip, please do so by Monday 12th January - we cannot take children swimming without this.

You child must be in school on time in order to get on the coach - it will not wait otherwise other children miss their lesson.

For swimming, children need a swimming costume and towel. Should you wish to send goggles or a swimming hat, then that is optional.

Children should not be wearing any kind of jewelry; exceptions are made for any religious items that cannot be removed.

Attendance Matters

Every student. Every day.

Our school attendance in the Autumn Term was **93.3%** - sadly this is below the same period last year and needs to improve.

We did experience a period of significant illness in children (and staff) during November and December but hopefully this is now past us.

Any families whose children's attendance is causing concern, will be contacted over the next few weeks so that we can discuss how this can improve. If you think we can help you at all, then please get in touch. We understand that a few children have very good reasons why their attendance is below the expected 96%, however these are a small minority. Also, remember that repeated lateness also impact attendance - if a child arrives after the school register closes, then that is counted as an unauthorised absence.

The school day begins at 8.45am.
